

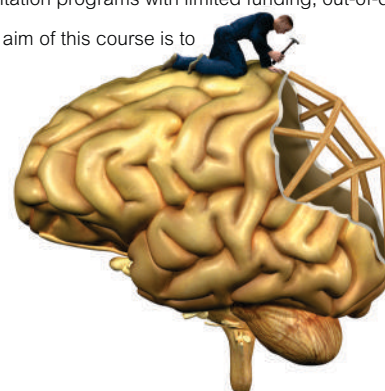
WORKING IN UNDER-RESOURCED SETTINGS

Ethical and relevant Neuropsychological practice

Neuropsychological assessment and practice in the South African context can be amongst the most challenging of endeavours. Not only do we have 11 official languages, but psychologists are frequently asked to conduct neuropsychological assessments or construct rehabilitation programs with limited funding, out-of-date normative data, and limited understanding of how a person's context can affect the outcome of the intervention. The aim of this course is to prepare the South African Neuropsychologists to meet those challenges in a constructive and progressive manner.

The course will focus on the following areas within under-resourced settings:

- Aspects of basic neuroanatomy, neuropathology, psychopathology and neuropharmacology
- A brief review of neuropsychological theory
- Considering special investigations, such as neuroimaging techniques
- Clinical assessment and neuropsychological testing
- Case formulation
- Neuro-rehabilitation and psychotherapy
- Professional issues



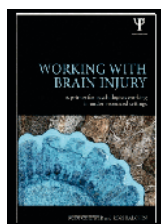
ETHICS COMPONENT

The core text deals with certain ethical guidelines, which are implied throughout the study, although they are dealt with specifically in the book. Section 3 covers key ethical concepts, such as autonomy, non-maleficence and truthfulness, which are the broad principles that guide ethical decision making. Ultimately, knowledge and practice of these principles assist the neuropsychologist in becoming a competent practitioner in under-resourced settings.

HOW DOES THE COURSE WORK?

- This is a self study course based on the book "Working with Brain Injury" by Rudi Coetzer and Ross Balchin.
- You are required to order the prescribed book yourself from takealot.com (R275). Allow two weeks for delivery.
- Soon after registration you will receive the short-answer questionnaire based on the prescribed book.
- You will be required to work through the textbook in your own time and complete the exam questionnaire.
- The questionnaires need to be completed independently and scanned and e-mailed to the SACNA office for marking, on or before the final submission date.
